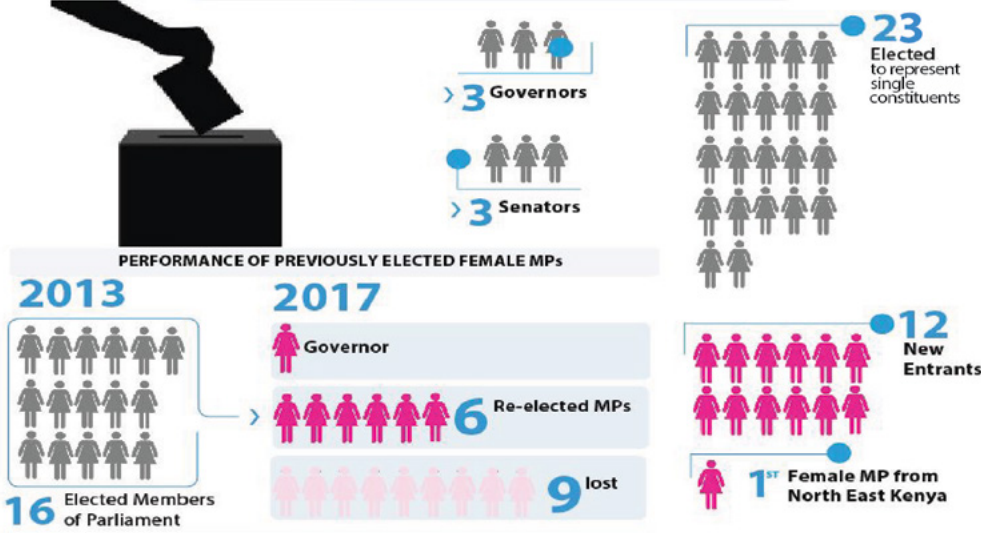


SUMMARY OF WOMEN ELECTED IN THE 2017 KENYA ELECTIONS

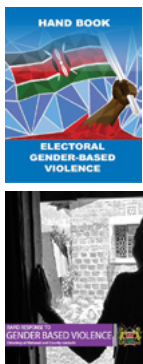
