

IDN SURVEY ON ELECTIONS, PEACE, SECURITY AND COHESION



- The survey was commissioned by Integrated Development Network (IDN) and conducted by Infotrak Research and Consulting using Computer Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI) through Infotrak's ICATi suite.
- A sample of 1500 respondents was interviewed to represent the 2017 projected adult population of **24,762,744**. The sample size translates into a margin of error of ± 2.53 at 95% degree of confidence.
- The sampling frame was designed to cover all the eight (8) Regions of Kenya. The sample split was guided by population proportionate to size as stipulated in the 2009 Kenya Population & Housing Census.
- Data was collected between 9th-12th April 2017. The questions asked are highlighted in each graphic presentation.

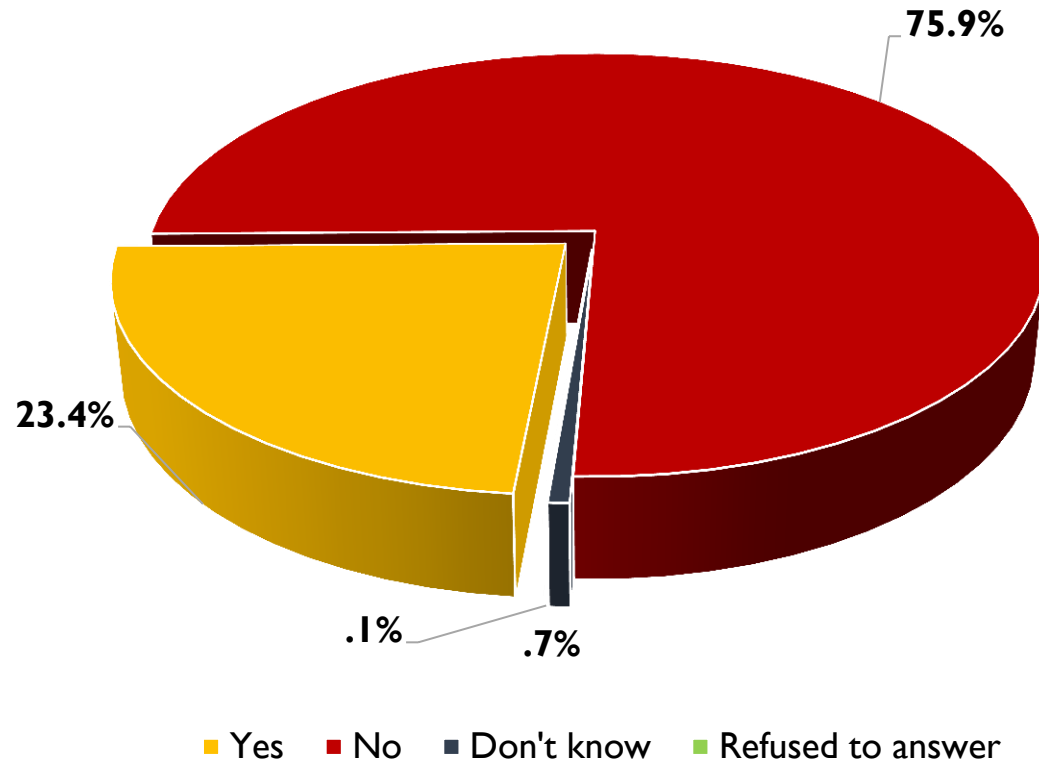

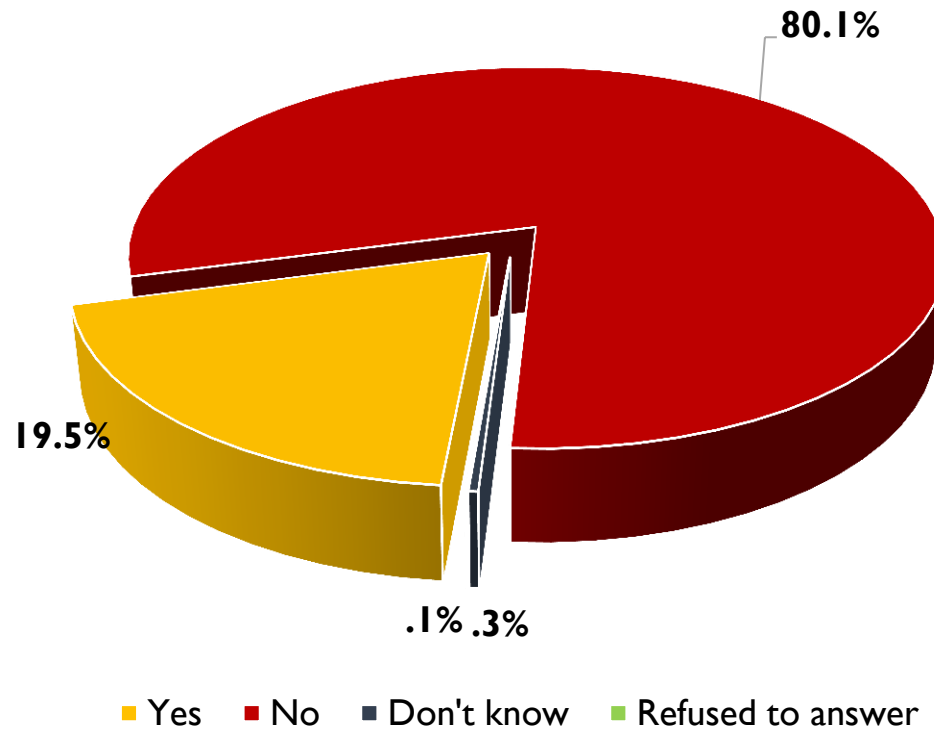

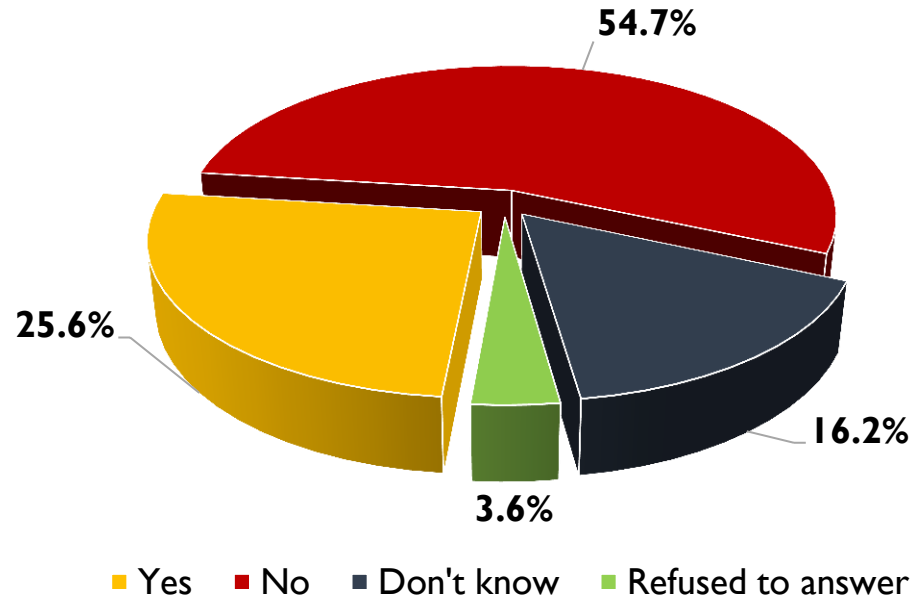

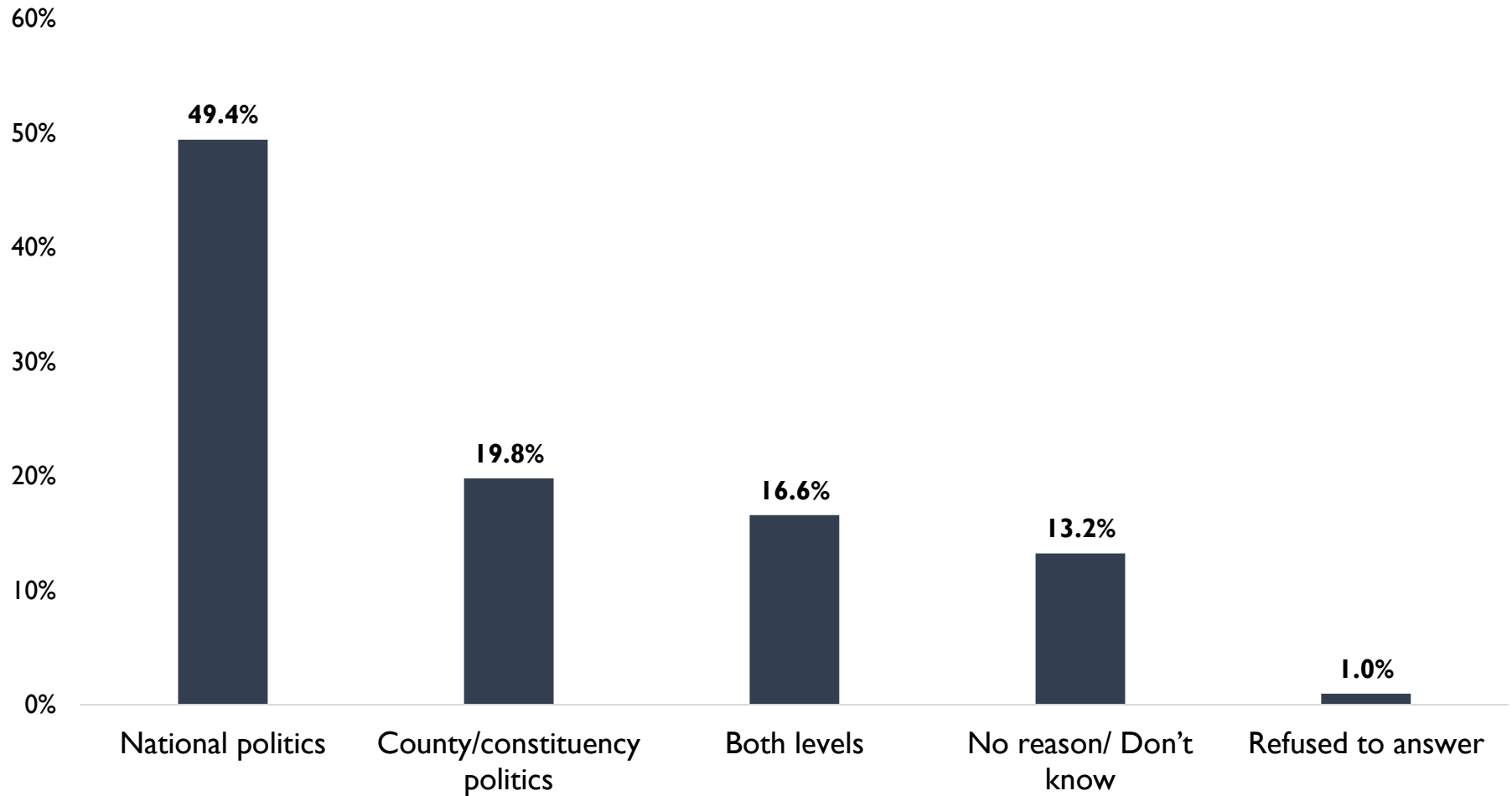

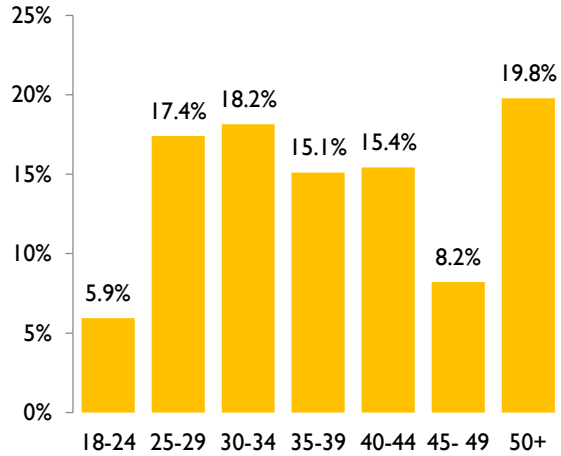
Level of politics that could trigger election related violence



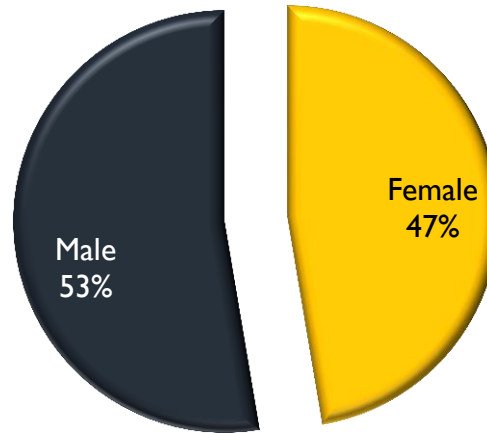

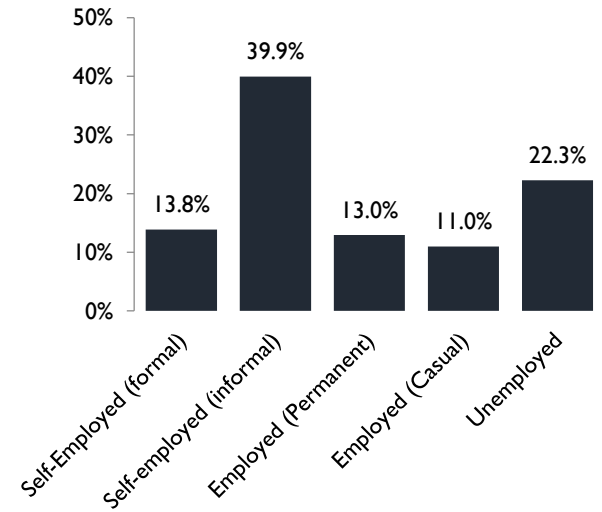
Age



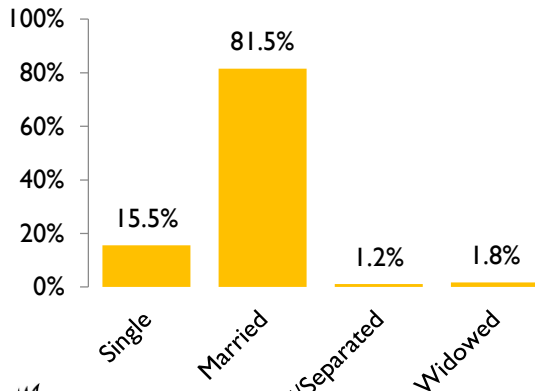
Gender



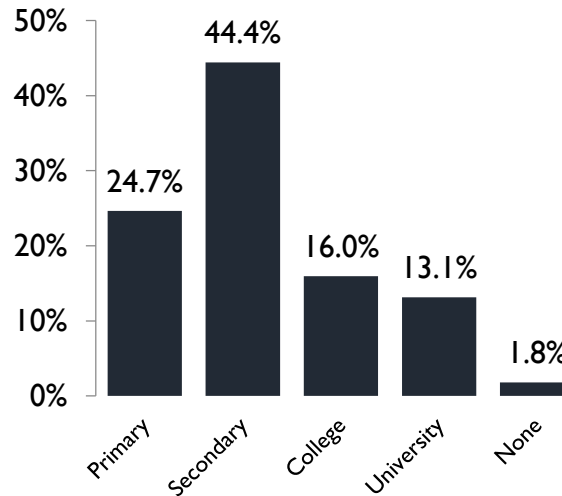
